STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

The **Standards of Conduct** shall serve as a guideline for how individuals are expected to behave when participating in the National Tournament. Students enrolled in an institution of higher learning assume an obligation to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with the college/university's function as an educational institution. When students participate in an event, by their registration in the event, they agree to represent their team and college/university in a way that does not detract from the reputation of the institution they are representing, and to act morally and display sportsmanship-like behavior, before, during, and after any competition. Guidelines of conduct include but are not limited to the examples outlined below.

Participants shall not:

- Use drugs, except for medical purposes, while traveling, competing, socializing, and/or using facilities including lodging spaces.
- Consume alcohol while traveling, competing, or spectating.
- Strike, attempt to strike or otherwise physically abuse an official, opposing player, spectator, or coach. Intentionally engage in or incite participants and/or spectators to engage in abusive or violent action. Use obscene gestures, profanity, or disrespectful language. Violate any policies of the host university, hotel, city, or state agency.

VIOLATION of the Standards of Conduct may result in:

- Suspension from the game/match or tournament.
- Forfeiture of individual and/or team awards.
- Ejection from the tournament hotel(s).
- Forfeiture of all games/ matches won and possible team elimination from current and future events.

ATHLETIC TRAINERS/EMERGENCY MEDICAL PERSONNEL

Athletic trainers will be available during the tournament; however, participants seeking pre-game services must bring their own supplies (i.e. tape, under wrap, and elastic bandage wrap). Emergency medical personnel and transportation to an appropriate care provider will be available in the event of participant injury. The participant will be responsible for all medical expenses, including ambulance transportation.
